Graduate Academic Study Abroad Program (Grad ASAP)

Grad ASAP weekly classes include approximately 7.5 hours for **Advanced Academic Writing**, 4 hours for **Graduate Research Seminar**, and approximately 3-4 hours for a **Graduate Course** (options available in Economics, Public Policy, Urban Planning, Logic and Philosophy of Science, Engineering, and Computer Science).

General Information:

- 1. Students will have access to **UCI libraries**, **computers**, etc. and receive a University **Division of Continuing Education ID card**, which can be used to obtain a **Photo ID Card** at UC Items if desired.
- 2. UC Irvine has campus Wi-Fi available (FREE) for those who bring their Laptop/ Notebook Computers. UCI computers are available in various locations around the campus and in the Main Library.
- 3. Students will have access to Division of Continuing Education student services including academic and immigration advising.
- 4. UC Irvine will have **Optional Activities** finalized before the courses begin. These activities might include Disneyland, Universal Studios, Surfing Lessons, Professional Sports, Musicals, etc. Students can pay fees for Activities upon arrival and on a first-come, first-served basis.
- 5. Students will have the opportunity to participate in **Free Activities** throughout the program, such as sports with international students, dance workshops, and more. The Activities staff can also suggest good places to shop, concerts, sports, etc. Information will be available upon arrival during the orientation and at the Activities Desk.
- 6. Campus Recreation Center membership is available for approximately \$30/month and includes use of the gym, Olympic sized pool, and tennis, racquetball, basketball courts, etc. (sports equipment, team activities, rock climbing wall, and special classes are available for an additional fee)
